

Volunteer Coaches Job Description

Rindge Recreation

Purpose

The Rindge Recreation volunteer position of a coach is intended to develop players to create a positive image of themselves, their teammates, coaches, game officials, and opponents. Coaches need to be good role models that create a positive learning environment in order for the children to learn sportsmanship, fundamental skills, teamwork, and responsibility.

Job Description

The Rindge Recreation Department's youth sports are to emphasize skill development, fair play, teamwork, cooperation, sportsmanship, responsibility, and fun. Each participant should be provided the opportunity to play in EVERY game, and play different positions on the field/court.

Requirements

- Must fill out a Background Check through the Rindge Recreation Department
- Sign and understand the Coaches Code of Conduct
- Regular attendance to all games and practices, during the times provided by the Sports Coordinator
- Communicate program information, game changes to parents and players

Responsibilities

- Teach fundamental skills to the children while emphasizing skill development, fair play, teamwork, sportsmanship, and fun.
- Provide a safe environment for practice and games – includes, checking equipment and condition of fields/courts
- Conduct appropriate training sessions with skills that are age appropriate
- Responsible for the children until they are turned over to a parent or guardian before leaving any game and/or practice
- Report any problems with the field/court, equipment, player behavior, parent behavior, or officials to the Sports Coordinator
- Abide by all official's decisions, there will be no tolerance for inappropriate behavior towards officials
- Work with the Sports Coordinator to set practices that work with the volunteer coaches schedule, in the given times and locations provided by the Sports Coordinator
- Clean up any trash and properly put away all equipment used for practices and games
- Help with handing out and collecting all jerseys
- Distribute practice and game schedules to parents
- Cooperate and support the Sports Coordinator on all coaching matters
- HAVE FUN! This is about the children learning and developing their skills, and should be top priority.



As a volunteer coach, you are responsible for the safety and well-being of your players. Your responsibility only extends to holding practices, teaching appropriate skill sets, providing a positive role model for the children, creating a safe and fun environment, and getting information to parents on games, cancellations, and meetings. All other matters will be left for the Sports Coordinator to provide to the volunteer coaches.
